Advanced Placement Exam Fees Can Be Found on PowerSchool.

Parents and guardians of high school students currently enrolled in one or more Advanced Placement (AP) courses can now find the cost of their child's spring AP exam(s) under the Balances tab in their family's PowerSchool account. Colleges often award course credit when a 3 or higher is earned on an AP exam, but students should check with their college of interest as to what the policy is for that specific school. Things quardians need to know include:

- Rates are \$85 per exam or \$53 per exam for students currently enrolled in the Free/Reduced Lunch Program.
- Payments can either be made in cash or with a check made out to BART.
- Payments must be handed to Ms. Shapiro-Van Dusen in the Student Office no later than **Thursday**, **March 1**.
- Materials will not be ordered for unpaid exams!
